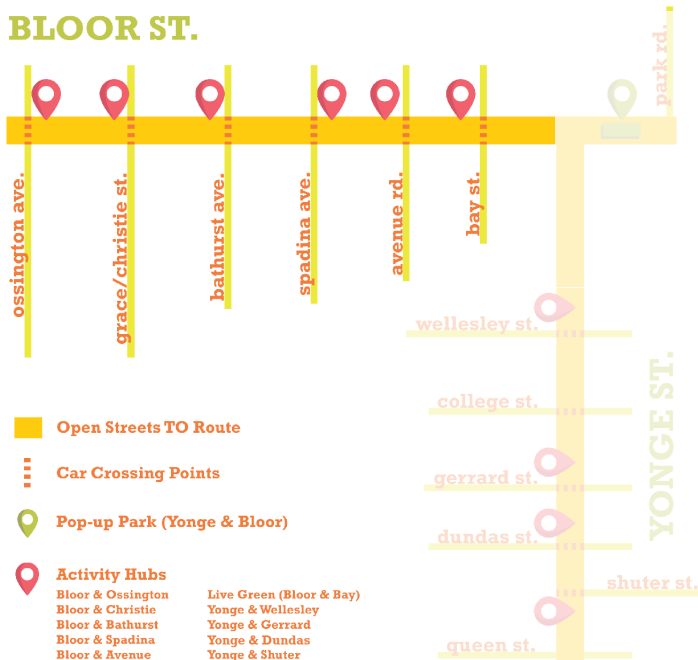

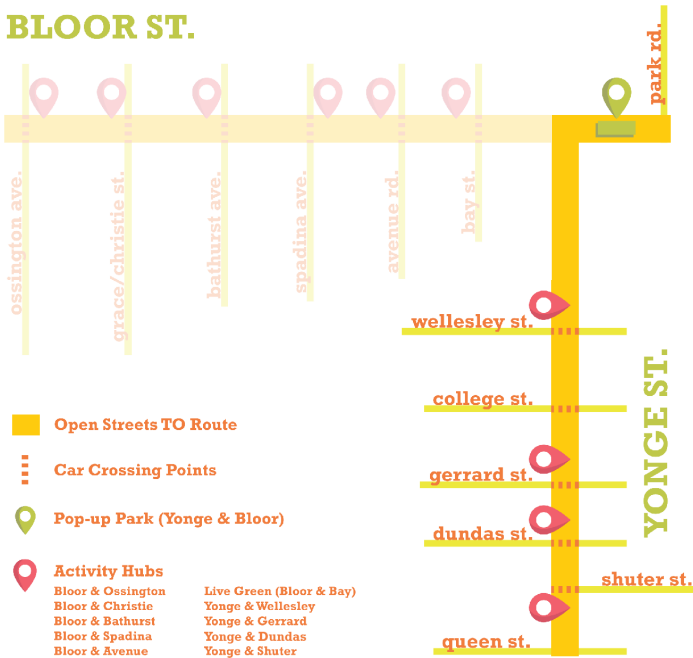
Bloor & Bay
